Thanks to everyone at Yuba :) it's been a fun journey!

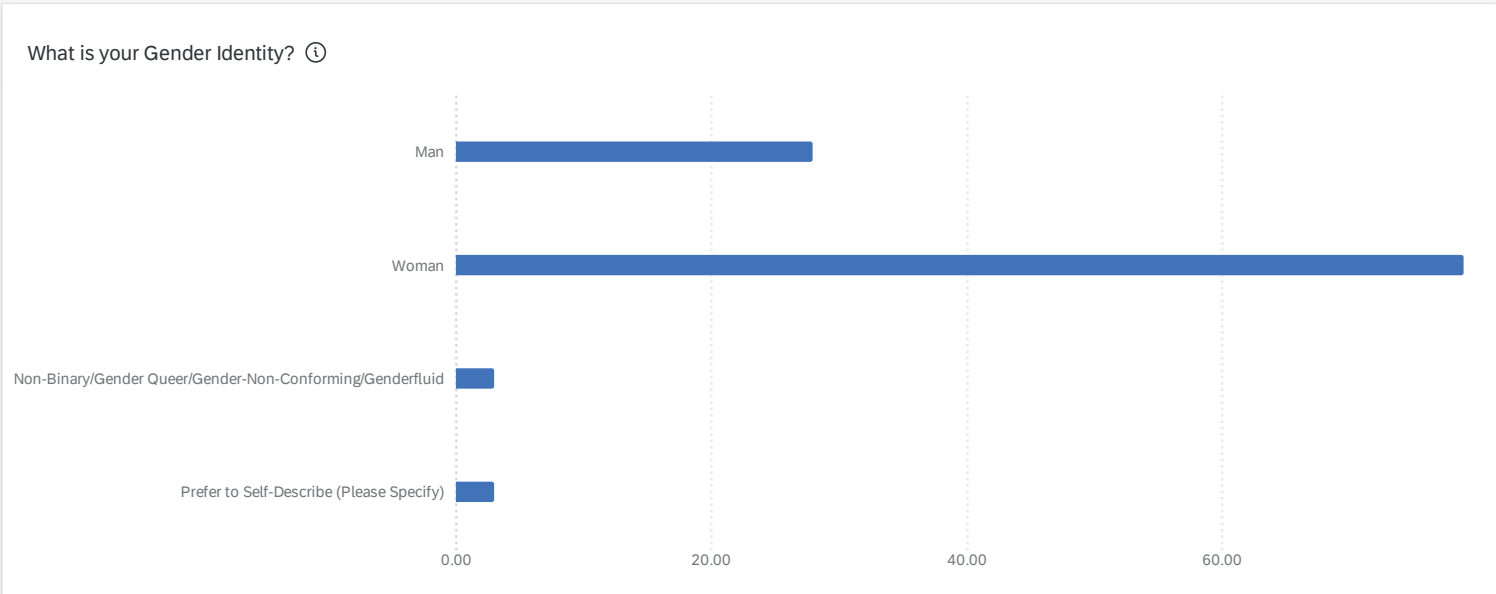

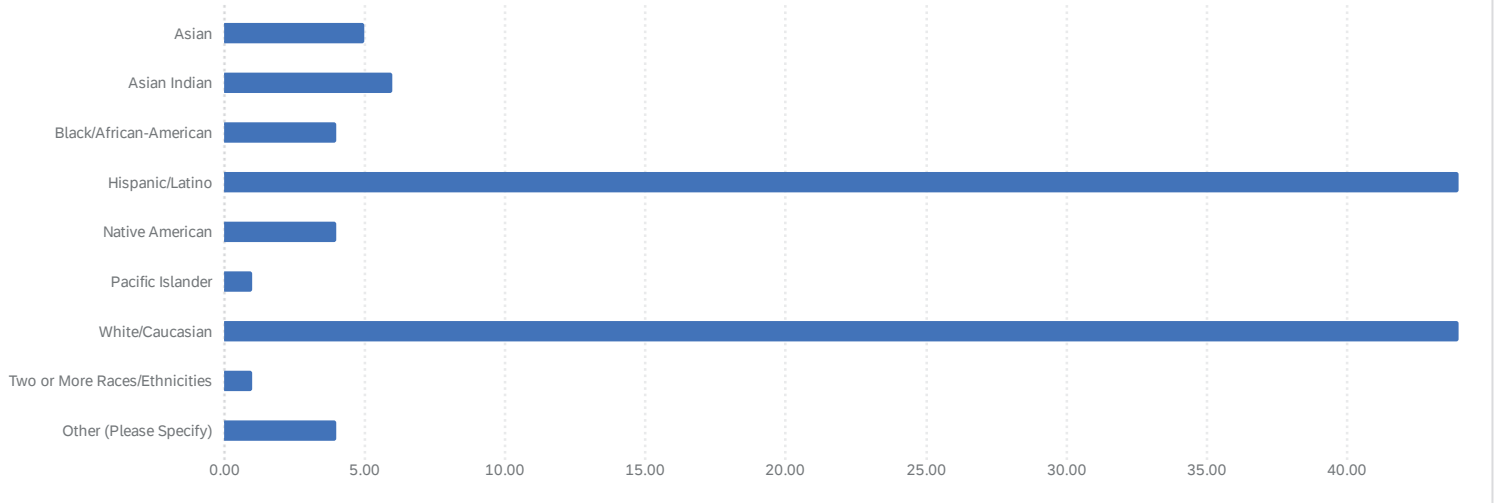

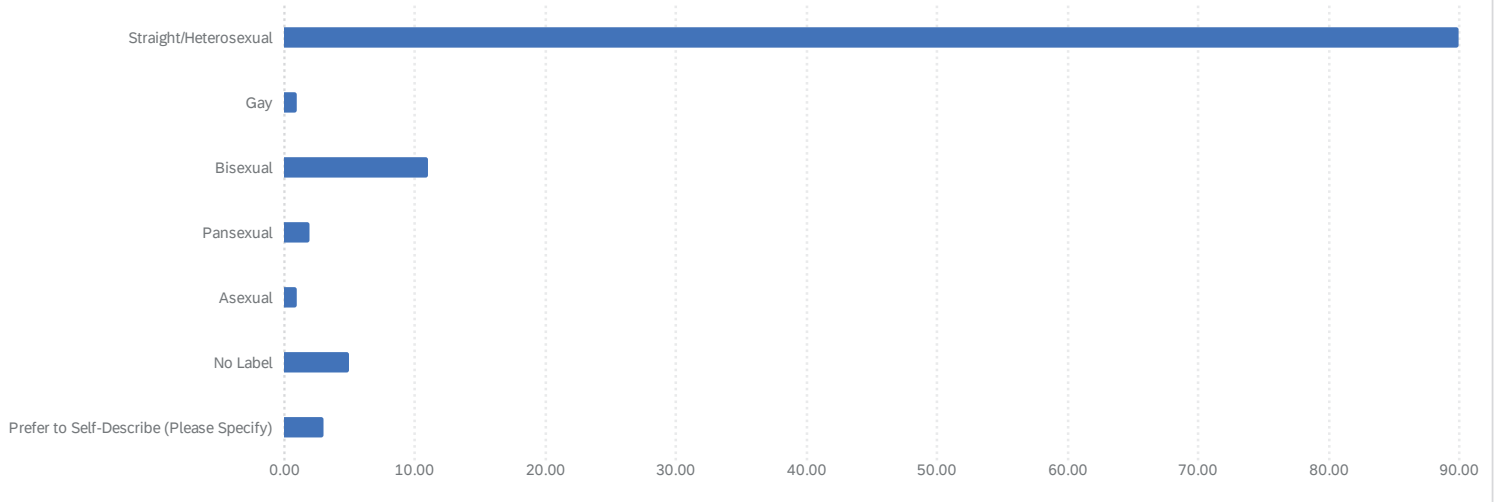
